




What percentage of the 10 most recent auto fatalities in IMWCA have been due to not wearing seatbelts?

Why Follow the Criteria?

Iowa Municipalities Workers' Compensation Association (IMWCA) Loss Control Criteria for Volunteer Fire Departments

Note: Junior firefighters are not volunteer firefighters, are not certified, and are not covered under workers' compensation. IMWCA recommends members follow the National Volunteer Fire Council (NVFC) Junior Firefighter Program including the parental consent form.

Status Update

1.	Policy requiring prospective members to undergo a physical examination prior to appointment to the department, then every five years thereafter. Yes No
2.	A written blood-borne pathogen exposure control plan has been completed. Yes No
3.	Hazardous Materials (HazMat) Operations level training for at least 25% of the department has been provided. Yes No
4.	Confined space rescue training and written procedures are in place. Yes No We do not perform rescues No entry policy Yes No
5.	Written on-site rehabilitation procedures have been adopted and implemented. Yes No
6.	A written respiratory protection plan is in place requiring firefighters who wear respirators to meet OSHA-required standards, including a satisfactory spirometry test if required by the reviewing medical professional. Yes No
7.	All existing members have taken a physical examination within the last five years. Yes No If not all physicals are complete, how many are left to be done?






